Matters listed below are hereby submitted with the following recommendations; to-wit:

1. 2001 Renewable Development Fund (RDF) grant award to Crown Hydro ([2017-01506](#))

Authorizing proper city officials to submit reply comments to the Public Utilities Commission, on behalf of the City of Minneapolis, recommending support of the position of the Metropolitan Council and other entities that the RDF grant awarded to Crown Hydro in 2001 be considered expired and the grant be terminated.

2. 2017 Federal Legislative Agenda ([2017-01031](#))

Approving an amendment to the City's federal legislative agenda which adds the City's position on the federal tax code reform.

4. Opposing Gun Conceal and Carry Reciprocity Laws ([2017-01516](#))

Passage of Resolution opposing gun conceal and carry reciprocity laws.

5. 2018 Legislative Policy Positions ([2017-01262](#))

Approving an additional policy position to the current bonding list for The Family Partnership's 36,000 square foot headquarters along with a childcare facility, a behavioral health clinic, a Center for Healing and Empowerment for victims of violence and sex trafficking, and space for training and community gathering.

Glidden moved to approve the following addition to the bonding list, to read: "\$10 million to transform a vital crossroads in South Minneapolis to house The Family Partnership's 36,000 square foot headquarters along with a childcare facility, a behavioral health clinic, a Center for Healing and Empowerment for victims of violence and sex trafficking, and space for training and community gathering."
