

REPORT TO THE CITY COUNCIL FROM
PUBLIC SAFETY & EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE
STANDING COMMITTEE OF THE MINNEAPOLIS CITY COUNCIL
May 17, 2018

A regular meeting of the committee was convened at 1:37 pm on this date.

Members Present: Alondra Cano (Chair), Steve Fletcher (Vice-Chair), Phillipe Cunningham, Jeremiah Ellison, Andrea Jenkins, and Linea Palmisano (Quorum - 4)

Matters listed below are hereby submitted with the following recommendations; to-wit:

1. Gift acceptance from Kelly Doran to supply Minneapolis 911 response officers with Narcan ([2018-00545](#))

Passage of Resolution accepting a donation in the amount of \$41,876 from Kelly Doran that will provide for Minneapolis 911 response officers and others to carry Narcan.

Cano moved to approve and refer to WM meeting of May 22, 2018. On voice vote, the motion passed.

2. Memorandum of Understanding with Summit Academy regarding cooperation in addressing campus sexual assaults ([2018-00554](#))

Authorizing a memorandum of understanding with Summit Academy defining responsibilities and requiring certain information sharing, in accordance with applicable state and federal privacy laws, about certain crimes occurring on-campus and in certain areas off-campus, including sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking.

Cano moved to approve. On voice vote, the motion passed.

3. Contract with the University of Minnesota Veterinary Medical Center for Police K-9 health services ([2018-00573](#))

Authorizing a contract with the University of Minnesota Veterinary Medical Center in the amount of \$34,560 for one (1) year from July 1, 2018-June 30, 2019, and using the contract form provided by the Regents of the University of Minnesota for veterinary services for Police K-9s.

Cano moved to approve and refer to WM meeting of May 22, 2018. On voice vote, the motion passed.

4. Contract amendment with SMG to reduce the hourly rate for 911 dispatchers ([2018-00599](#))

Approving an amendment to Contract No. C-43673 with SMG reducing the hourly rate for 911 dispatchers from \$105 per hour to \$65 per hour, for a new not-to-exceed amount of \$523,500, for the entire contract (new not-to-exceed amount of \$19,500 for 911 dispatchers), for Vikings football preseason, Vikings football regular season, X Games Minneapolis and other large scale events at US Bank Stadium, excluding Final Four events.

Staff presentation by Robin McPherson, Police Department.

Ellison moved to approve and refer to WM meeting of May 22, 2018, including direction to clarify that the contract amendment reflects the correction of an error in the contract. On voice vote, the motion passed.

5. Homelessness and Vulnerable Populations Initiative ([2018-00601](#))

Receiving and filing an introduction to the Minneapolis Police Department's (MPD) Homelessness and Vulnerable Populations Initiative including discussion of objectives, proposed strategies, and exploring common ground for a viable point of entry to address these issues.

Staff presentation by Grant Snyder, Police Department.

Cano moved to receive and file. On voice vote, the motion passed.

6. Eviction and Calls for Service Study ([2018-00600](#))

Receiving and filing the Police Conduct Oversight Commission's (PCOC) study on the intersection between policing and evictions in Minneapolis.

Staff presentation by Imani Jaafar & Ryan Patrick, Civil Rights Department.

Cano moved to receive and file. On voice vote, the motion passed.

7. Contract amendment with Hennepin County regarding the Hennepin County Jail ([2018-00598](#))

Directing the City Coordinator's Office, in conjunction with the Minneapolis Police Department and the City Attorney's Office, to seek amendments to the contract for jail services to include provisions that promote a separation between local law enforcement and federal immigration enforcement and protect the City's immigrant communities to the greatest extent that is consistent with federal law and any other applicable state laws or Rules.

The Chair afforded the courtesy of the floor to Council Member Gordon, who spoke in support of the item.

Cano moved to approve. On voice vote, the motion passed.

With no further business to transact, the meeting adjourned at 3:00 pm.
