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# Fast Track Cities Background

- Fast Track Cities is a global partnership between high HIV burden cities
- The initiative's aim is end AIDS as a public health threat by 2030
- Implementation is designed to meet four targets

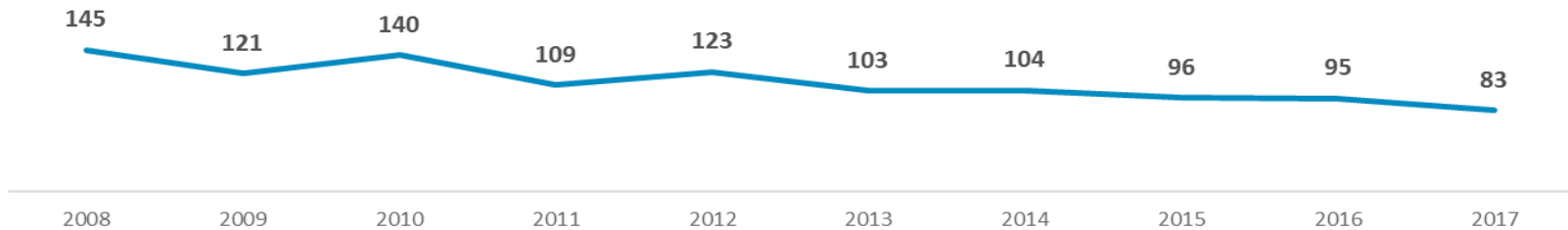


# Fast Track Targets

- 90% People Living With HIV (PLWHIV) know their status
- 90% People who know their HIV + status will receive treatment
- 90% of PLWHIV on HIV treatment will have suppressed viral loads
- Zero stigma and discrimination against PLWHIV

# State of HIV in Minneapolis

HIV dx among Minneapolis residents, 2008 - 2017



**3145** Minneapolis residents lived with HIV/AIDS in 2017.

Men who have sex with men (MSM) and African American were mostly impacted.

Between 2015 and 2017:

- **66%** of all diagnoses were MSM
- **45%** of all diagnoses were African American

African American women were also disproportionately impacted.

Between 2015 and 2017:

- **33%** of female diagnoses were US-born African American
- **36%** of female diagnoses were Foreign-born African American

# Minneapolis Fast Track

- A Fast Track Task Force was convened
- Plan developed to be complementary to the existing plans of Hennepin County and the State
- Partners have helped secure community support
- Working with Fast Track to launch our dashboard



# Minneapolis Action Plan

## **90% of PLWHIV know their status**

- Community engagement with hardest hit community members
- Engagement of organizations who reach PLWHIV
- Work with community clinics to implement “opt out” HIV testing
- Develop Fast Track clinic designation and criteria

# Minneapolis Action Plan

## **90% of PLWHIV are retained in care**

- Partner with Hennepin County and MDH to achieve this goal
- Access to Minneapolis specific data
- Work with CPED, the housing coalition and IGR on housing support



# Minneapolis Action Plan

**90% PLWHIV are virally suppressed**

- Partner with MDH and Hennepin County to achieve this goal



# Minneapolis Action Plan

## Zero Stigma and Discrimination

- Gather data from impacted communities on extent of stigma
- Promote voices of those thriving with HIV
- Review City policy/procedures tracking discrimination against PLWHIV
- Social Justice issue that affects all

# Moving Forward

- Funding dependent
- Applying for RWJF grant to work with Hennepin County on the stigma goal
- Change item request has been submitted to the Enterprise's budgeting process for consideration
- Reconvene the Fast Track Taskforce



# For Council Consideration

- Part of the on-going work is to expand the already existing Fast Track Taskforce. Currently there is representation from the Mayor's office, Councilmember Bender's office, Councilmember Cunningham's office, Hennepin County and a few community based organization. **Are there others that you believe should be part of advising this work moving forward?**
- The plan is to pick 2-3 of the Action Steps to work on each year. **Are there one that you believe should be prioritized?**
- One of the priorities if funded will be to gather quantitative and qualitative data from impacted communities about the extent and degree of both internalized and external stigma. **Are there individuals or groups from your Ward that you believe that we should specifically include in this process?**
