

Legislative Directive

Pursuant to City Charter Section 7.1(h)(2), the Minneapolis City Council, in support of its official legislative, policymaking, and oversight functions, does request from the Mayor the following information and data:

1. A comprehensive overview of how the proposed Community Safety Center and service delivery model will contribute to the implementation of the Safe and Thriving Communities service continuum model that includes preventative, restorative, and responsive programs.
2. A list of specific community safety functions and breakdown of specific programs to be co-located with the MPD Third Precinct at 2633 Minnehaha Ave., which are the basis for the projected additional \$7 to \$8.5 million cited in Mayor Frey's Community Safety Center Proposal.
3. Information about the proposed development of a Community Safety Center, including:
  - (a) Details about the City's work plan and associated timeline for the Community Safety Center including, among other items, which City departments are engaged in the work and their responsibility for specific components of the work plan.
  - (b) Details about any planned community outreach and engagement strategies about the proposal, the work plan, and associated timeline, including the potential use of participatory frameworks and tools, similar to those used by the Race Equity, Inclusion & Belonging Department for the City's Truth & Reconciliation Commission, such as a memorandum of understanding (MOU), community benefits agreement or similar evaluation methods.

Present the requested information, including any proposed changes or policy implementations, along with a fiscal analysis of any recommendations to the appropriate Minneapolis City Council committee no later than January 31, 2024.
