Restructuring the Minneapolis Advisory Committee on Housing to serve as an advisory board to the Mayor and City Council on matters related to housing policy and development.

Whereas, Minneapolis communities are facing multiple housing challenges, including homelessness, displacement of existing residents, a lack of affordable housing, insufficient housing supply, and poor health impacts from housing; and

Whereas, housing instability negatively affects the quality of life, physical health, and mental well-being of Minneapolis residents; and

Whereas, addressing these housing challenges is a clear priority for the City of Minneapolis; and

Whereas, Resolution 2018R-168 adopted May 25, 2021, established the Minneapolis Advisory Committee on Housing to advise the Mayor, City Council, and city departments regarding matters related to housing policy and development, rental licensing, and other areas which affect the accessibility, maintenance, and development of stable, quality, sustainable, healthy, and affordable housing in the City of Minneapolis; and

Whereas, the committee was established to offer another platform for Minneapolis residents to engage in and contribute to cross-sector, cross-department dialogue on housing issues; and

Whereas, the City Council seeks to update the enabling legislation to reflect current membership structure and requirements;

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved by The City Council of The City of Minneapolis:

That the Minneapolis Advisory Committee on Housing is hereby re-established and shall operate according to the following structure:

1. Number of members: 22 voting members.
2. Term Length: 24 months.
3. Term Limit: None.
4. Staggered Terms: None.
5. Compensation: None.
6. Open appointment process: Yes.
7. Public hearings held for appointees: No.
8. Residency requirement: Yes.
9. Membership structure:
 1. 12 resident members, with 8 to be appointed by the City Council and 4 to be appointed by the Mayor. This group of residents should reflect the racial/ethnic, geographic, and gender diversity of Minneapolis, and include the following perspectives:
 1. Renters;
 2. Homeowners;
 3. Persons who have experienced homelessness, including youth through age 24;
 4. Rental property owners; and
 5. Advocates for affordable housing, greater housing supply, renters' rights, sustainability and health in housing, or other issues related to housing.
 2. 10 representatives of organizations and entities that work on housing affordability, creation, preservation, and management, including one representative from each of the following:
 1. Two representatives of the Lived Expertise Advisory Group (LEAG) of the Hennepin County Continuum of Care or another Continuum of Care organization;
 2. Minneapolis Public Schools;
 3. Minneapolis Public Housing Authority;
 4. An organization that provides emergency or overnight shelter services in Minneapolis;
 5. An organization that advises and advocates for renters;
 6. A nonprofit community development organization;
 7. An organization that advocates for rental property owners;

8. An organization that helps support homeownership and the elimination of racial disparities in homeownership rates; and
9. An organization that works for equity in housing, especially as it relates to preventing involuntary displacement of low income communities of color.
10. Supporting department: Community Planning and Economic Development.
11. Reporting requirements: The Committee will deliver an annual report to the appropriate committee of the City Council.
12. Selection of officers: The committee will select a chair and vice-chair bi-annually from its members.
13. Open meetings: Meetings shall be open to the public, subject to the requirements of the Minnesota Open Meeting Law.
