Chief of Police

The Chief of Police is the Executive leader of the Minneapolis Police Department. The Chief is responsible for directing and coordinating all police services for the City of Minneapolis in providing a safe environment for its residents, businesses and guests, including crime prevention, investigation and apprehension.



Assistant Chief

The assistant Chief oversees the day-to-day operations of the Minneapolis Police Department. They also oversees all bureaus within the MPD including Patrol, Investigations, Professional Standards, Special Operations and Intelligence Division Health & Wellness Unit.



Deputy Chief of Investigations

Manages the operations of the Investigations division of the police department.

Deputy Chief of Patrol

Manages the operations of the Patrol division of the police department.

Manages the operations of the Patrol division of the police department.

Manages the operations of the Community Engagement and Procedural Justice Division of the police department.
