

Legislative Directive

Pursuant to City Charter Section 7.1(h)(2), the Minneapolis City Council, in support of its official legislative, policymaking, and oversight functions, does request from the Mayor the following information and data:

1. A comprehensive analysis on any operational and/or institutional changes made by the City of Minneapolis related to staffing based on the recommendations from the 2022 Minneapolis Police Department and Emergency Communications Center Staffing and Operations Assessment and Review of Problem Nature Codes. Including the following:
 - a. An overview of any barriers that have hindered in implementation of recommendations.
 - b. Any fiscal considerations or assistance needed for full implementation of recommendations.
 - c. A summary of specific actions related to increasing MPD's investigative units, including any specific recruitment utilizing dollars from American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding.
2. An update on response times from 2022 and 2023 to the city's most frequently used problem nature codes as well as the identified longest to clear problem nature codes, including a breakdown by individual precincts.

Present the requested information, including any proposed changes or policy implementations, along with a fiscal analysis of any recommendations to the Public Health and Safety Committee no later than May 15, 2024.
